Whereas, by authority of Section 325.19(F) of the Ohio Revised Code, and in accordance with the opinion issued by the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney on March 18, 1991, the Board does hereby adopt the following alternative schedule of legal holidays for Butler County during the year 2019, which the schedule is not inconsistent with the provisions of collective bargaining agreements governing bargaining-unit employees of Butler County:
